Implement dovetailed study support in all districts of the city as well as commence initiatives to prevent students from dropping out of senior high school. Also, support various activities undertaken by communities to help children and households, such as the "Kids Café" setup.

Boosting Child and Student Sup- School Route Safety Measures



Four school social workers have been newly appointed and counsellors (for the type of integrated education from elementary-to-junior high school) have been appointed to all junior high school blocks. In this way, systems will be strengthened as a link to early discovery and resolving of bullying.



Further promote initiatives to enhance traffic safety on school routes through actions such as installing sidewalks and fitting out streets with "safety color belts".

Strengthening of Growth Fields and Promotion of Small and Medium Firms


Knowing the Budget

Question

What is a Budget?

A budget is the estimation of revenues and disbursements for a single given year.


Prior to the start of each new fiscal year, the government and local public bodies (municipalities and prefectures) estimate the monetary sums for revenues (such as taxes) and disbursements (such as those used in administrative service), and plan the details of operations, etc. Such an estimate is known as a "budget".



Question

How is a budget decided?

The mayor prepares a budget draft, which is deliberated upon and adopted by the city council.



Yokohama City Budget -for FY2017-

Yokohama city budget is divided into three groups (accountants) based on the differences in uses and revenue sources.

General account

1,645.9 billion yen

Main reason for increase is derived from operating costs (151billion yen) needed because jurisdiction of salary payment for prefectural school personnel (teachers for city-run elementary and junior high compulsory education schools, and special education schools) was transferred from the prefecture to Yokohama city in April 2017.

Consolidation of welfare, medical care, education, roads and parks, etc.

This is the account for implementing basic administration services. City taxes are mainly used for this general account.

Special work is undertaken with special revenue, so the account for that is independent of the general account, in order to clarify the revenue and disbursement.


What kind of taxes are there?

Taxes are collected from everybody to provide the necessary money for life to go on in society

- so, they can be thought of as membership fees to underpin society.

Taxes are comprised of national taxes, which are paid to the state, and local taxes, which are paid to the prefecture and municipality.

Typical Taxes from the Point of View of Life in Yokohama



Note 1: The above taxes are just examples. There are many other taxes and city subsidized revenues. Moreover, the terms have been simplified here.

Note 2: The municipal (individual resident tax) and prefectural (individual prefectural resident tax) segments of individual inhabitant tax are combined and paid to Yokohama City.

Note 3: The tax rates for consumption tax and local consumption tax are the current tax rates as of 1 April 2017. Municipalities receive a part of the local consumption taxes as local consumption tax delivered fund from prefectures.

Note 4: In the case of corporations, the taxes include corporate municipality/prefectural resident tax (local tax) and corporation tax (national tax).

What administration services are taxes used for?

Child care/education
