

23.03.2017 News | Keio University Team GB Tokyo 2020 Signing Ceremony held at Keio University



The signing ceremony for the Team GB Preparation Camp for Tokyo 2020 was held in the Event Hall of the Kyosei-kan Collaboration Complex at Hiyoshi Campus on Tuesday, March 21. President Seike attended the ceremony along with the Chairman of the British Olympic Association (BOA), Sir Hugh Robertson, the Mayor of Yokohama City, Ms. Fumiko Hayashi, the Mayor of Kawasaki City, Mr. Norihiko Fukuda, and the President of the Japanese Olympic Committee, Mr. Tsunekazu Takeda.

Keio University and the cities of Yokohama and Kawasaki concluded a Memorandum of Understating with BOA in February 2016 for hosting the British Olympic Team's preparation camp for Tokyo 2020. The contract signed at this ceremony determines the use of facilities, as well as the partnership between the four parties, including the facilities to be used, duration, the sports to be hosted, and exchange projects. Keio University is due to host a total of thirteen events—archery, fencing, modern pentathlon, badminton, gymnastics, table tennis, basketball, judo, taekwondo, boxing, weightlifting, karate, and hockey—from July 3 to August 11, 2020 (including the camp set-up period), centering on the Commemorative Hall, the Athletics Field, and the Mamushidani Gymnasium on Hiyoshi Campus. In addition to the provision of facilities, the university will work to deepen exchange in areas other than sports such as research, education, history, culture, and art. It will also help make contributions to both the regional and international communities going forward.

Mr. Ryo Tateishi, a graduate of Keio University and a bronze medalist in the 200-meter breaststroke at the London Olympics, served as the master of ceremonies. The four representatives of the partnership each gave a short address following Mr. Tateishi's explanation of the contract. A guest speech was then made by the British Ambassador to Japan, His Excellency Paul Madden CMG, after which the representatives signed the contract bringing the ceremony to a close. A post-ceremony reception was held in a friendly atmosphere in the adjacent venue.

## 28.05.2018 News | Keio University Keio Signs MOU as Official Partner of ParalympicsGB



Keio University concluded a memorandum of understanding (MOU) with the British Paralympic Association (BPA) represented by CEO Tim Hollingsworth regarding the preparation camp of ParalympicsGB for the Tokyo 2020 Paralympic Games together with Kawasaki City and the City of Yokohama. The MOU Signing Ceremony was held at Keio University's Hiyoshi Campus on Thursday, May 24, 2018.

The four partners aim to facilitate exchange not only in relation to the preparation camp, but in the disciplines of sports science, medicine, and education, in various cultural fields, and with the regional communities. Among the attendees were the British Judo Team headed by Ian Johns, which held a Randori session with members of the Keio Judo Club earlier that morning.

Keio University President Akira Haseyama acknowledged the team as he gave his speech, stating that "Para-athletes allow us to realize just how diverse the world is and are the prime example of how much one can achieve." He also expressed his belief "that working as a team together with the world-class para-athletes and the support staff of ParalympicsGB here at

Hiyoshi Campus will have a hugely positive influence, and I am certain that this will be a oncein-a-lifetime experience, not only for our students, but for the whole Keio community." Furthermore, he reinforced the university's commitment and support by adding that "Keio will do all it can to impart the strength and vitality of this event and ensure the athletes of ParalympicGB will be able to compete at their highest level."

It should also be noted that Keio and the two cities officially agreed to host the preparation camp of Team GB in March 2017.

[Yokohama City Event Report] December 03 (Monday): "Seminar for Learning About the United Kingdom and Yokohama" Learning from The United Kingdom's Inclusive Society Culture] Implemented as Part of the Project for Recruiting a Host Town for Great Britain's Preparation Camp!



The City of Yokohama has been moving ahead with initiatives in various fields related to the host town for Great Britain's preparation camp in order to foster opportunities for welcoming the GB national team to Japan ahead of 2020.

Welcoming guests from Great Britain's Olympic Committee, Yoshie Kurisu held a seminar focusing on the inclusive society of Great Britain and held a program providing experiences of British culture.

The seminar was attended by approximately fifty people who had applied in advance, and the British House, where the seminar was held, was filled almost to capacity. Thanks to everyone who participated!

Here is a brief introduction to the seminar.

The seminar started with a speech by Bill Sweeny, the CEO of the British Olympic Committee.

During his speech, Bill said, "The Tokyo 2020 Olympics and Paralympics provide us with a valuable opportunity to spread the word about Japan's culture, etc., throughout the world. Yokohama will also be the first place that the young team GB athletes experience when they arrive in Japan. I pray that the Tokyo 2020 Olympics will be a wonderful event."

In 2016, Ms. Kurisu took part in the flag handover ceremony at the Rio Paralympics as a stage advisor.

She then decided that she wanted to foster coaches capable of providing guidance for disabled people in order to adopt aerial training (techniques for aerial stage performances) in Japan, and consequently invited coaches from the United Kingdom to train coaches over here. She has collaborated with UK artist teams up until now, and intends to take an active role in ensuring that this continues.

She states that her aim is to ensure that both disabled people and people without disabilities can come together to take part in programs from 2021 that enable disabled people to engage in activities as they like and at the level they prefer within their own community.

- \*1: An NPO established under the concept of slowing down the pace of the currently fastmoving society a little so that everybody can enjoy their lives. It aims at creating a society that is in accord with diversity through the power of art.
- \*2: People who remove all barriers from the stage and create environments that promote creativity so that disabled artists can perform.
- \*3: Escorts who accompany disabled artists onto the stage and collaboratively expand their potential.



After this speech, a group of musicians who love Celtic music from Keio University, where it has been decided that Team GB will hold its preparation camp, gave a performance. They had practiced a number of English songs especially for this day.



Members of the Design Team Liviu spared some of their time to assist in the teatime portion of the evening, and served slightly large volumes of traditional English fare (mince pies, sausage rolls, shortbread). The food was slightly different to what is normally served during afternoon tea, which is a little more refined. Hopefully, they will serve an authentic afternoon tea next time.



The World Christmas 2018 event was held in annex 8 of the Yamate Seiyoukan in December. Ms. Kasai and Ms. Ishihata of Design Team Liviu decorated the British House with a wonderful array of British-style Christmas decorations. Some of these decorations were also on display at the venue.



The event was carried out on a high note thanks to the speeches, performances, teatime and the British atmosphere.

We collaborated with Scotland to promote the Olympics and Paralympics to its local citizens.



Based on the relationship of mutual exchange that started in the mid 19th century, the city of Yokohama and the Scottish Government have been working together, especially in 2019 and 2020, in the areas of: (1) exchange programs in the fields of culture and tourism, (2) promotion of networks between companies and institutions related to the marine industry, (3) civic exchanges triggered by the Rugby World Cup 2019<sup>™</sup> and the Tokyo 2020 Olympics and Paralympics, (4) promotion of inter-university collaboration including student and academic exchanges.

In October 2019, Fiona Hyslop, the Cabinet Secretary for Economy, Fair Work and Culture of the Scottish Government, visited Japan for the Rugby World Cup 2019<sup>™</sup> and met Fumiko Hayashi, the Mayor of Yokohama. They reconfirmed their commitment to deepen the relationship toward the Olympic and Paralympic Games.

We are conducting promotional activities in local areas in Scotland in order to deepen our relationship with Scotland and become a better partner, and to give everyone in Scotland a chance to get to know Yokohama in preparation for the Olympics.

In 2018, we distributed information on tourism in Yokohama through Scottish magazines and online media. We continued two projects in 2019. First, we asked the world travel bloggers known as "Two Scots Abroad", a couple from Scotland who have a major influence, to cover and convey the attractive aspects of Yokohama which they discovered during their trip by posting them on their blog. Second, we promoted the attractive business environment, including the support for startups in Yokohama, to local areas through online magazines and business media in Scotland.

On Monday, 20th January, we held a forum on "The Impact of Amplifying Creativity on the City – Welcome to Creative Dundee" in Yokohama.



To boost momentum toward welcoming the British Olympic team to the Tokyo 2020 Games, Yokohama City is actively preparing for the British preparation camp and host town program in various ways.

In this forum, we welcomed Ms. Lori Anderson, director of "Creative Dundee", which is a key player in the creative industry in Scotland. The forum was held on the theme "The Impact of Amplifying Creativity on the City" along with guests such as creators, organizers, and editors who are active both in and outside of Yokohama.



First, Ms. Lori introduced the approach of Creative Dundee. Their efforts were very interesting, such as publishing a city guidebook that lists sightseeing spots selected by citizens and holding a networking event where presentations and competitions were held in a competition style. In addition, through the idea that "creativity can be a positive catalyst," she explained that her business focuses on conveying information, networking to connect people, and collaborating with other fields.

In order to make social issues known to many people, activities on applying creativity in various fields were introduced, such as a project in which an artist creates a work such as an illustration that depicts greenhouse gas reductions and then shares it, and an architect-led residence support site for single-parent families.





In the latter half, the discussion focused on questions from participants. Ms. Lori appreciated the potential and vision in Yokohama, saying, "People in Yokohama understand creativity and show their involvement through effective networking," and added, "To define a vision for urban policy, we need to seek what the city's needs are and what to do about it."
