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About This Booklet

This booklet introduces organizations and groups in Yokohama, Japan, that are actively working on Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and Education for Sustainable Development (ESD). It was created by members of Japan RCE Youth who participated in the Japan RCE Youth Meeting. The event, supported by RCE Yokohama and Yokohama City, was co-hosted by the RCE Yokohama Youth Group and the United Nations University Institute for the Advanced Study of Sustainability (UNU-IAS). It took place on February 16 and 17, 2024, in Yokohama, Kanagawa Prefecture, Japan.

During the fieldwork in February, participants visited various organizations in the Yokohama area engaged in practical efforts related to the SDGs. They shared the knowledge and insights gained from these experiences and summarized them in this booklet. The booklet is to serve as a valuable resource for those interested in local efforts towards achieving the SDGs, particularly by young people. Additionally, it introduces specific activities and best practices of organizations working on SDGs and ESD in the Yokohama area, with the intention of providing ideas for sustainable transformation in local communities in the future.
