### Correctly Understanding the Work Involved in Impounding Dogs

A large number of incidents involving dog bites occur throughout the country every year. In the event of a report on a loose dog being received, the dog is impounded by the ward's Health and Welfare Center or Animal Protection Center.

This is important work for preventing the spread of rabies and dog bite incidents, as well as for protecting dogs from becoming involved in traffic accidents, etc.

Unfortunately, the people involved in this work often face verbal and physical discrimination by being violently criticized for their actions as if they were doing something terrible. These workers are under a great deal of mental stress due to this.

We hope that everybody will understand that the work they are doing helps us all live pleasant and anxiety-free lives.
