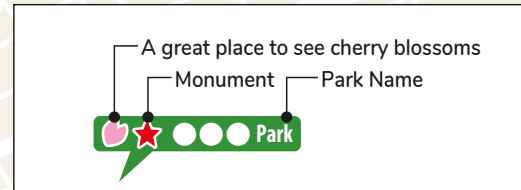

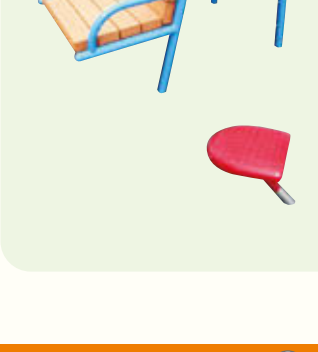
Pull-up bar

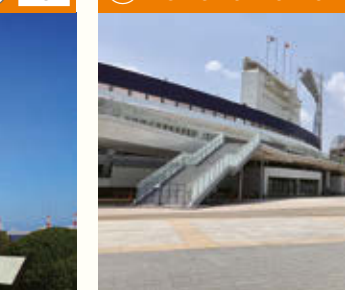
